



Adult Mission Trip to Midwest Mission Distribution Center Chatham, Illinois April 3 - 5, 2024

Join our team volunteering at the Midwest Mission Distribution Center! You can choose to stay on-site at the dormitory or stay 7 miles away at the Comfort Inn and Suites in Springfield, IL. We leave Beloit the morning of Wednesday, April 3, and carpool to Springfield, IL. We will work on Thursday and Friday, and return to Beloit on Friday evening, Apr. 5.

If you stay in the dormitory, the cost of the trip is \$160 plus the cost of one lunch and three dinners at area restaurants. If you choose to stay at the motel, the cost of the trip is \$75 plus the cost your room at the Comfort Inn and the cost of the previous meals. The Comfort Inn room will be approximately \$115 per room per night. You are welcome to arrange to share a room with another person on the trip.

Please do NOT let the cost of the trip keep you from signing up! There is money available in a fund specifically to help people with the cost of participating in the adult mission trip. Please let Diane Gemignani know if you are interested in the assistance.

You may bring in flowers for no reason, or there can be a sentence in the bulletin that states the special occasion for which the flowers are being provided.





Missions

Loose Coins for January go to **Family Promise of Greater Beloit**. This is the organization formerly known as Hands of Faith which provides homeless families temporary shelter, but also extensive support services to ensure families can remain secure in housing and employment. In their new facility at 1006 Bluff St., Family Promise of Greater Beloit has nine guest sleeping rooms, two living room areas, a computer/resource room, and laundry and bathroom facilities. In addition to shelter, Family Promise focuses on three areas of support for families:

Prevention -- More than 40% of American families are said to be one unexpected expense away from financial distress. Family Promise of Greater Beloit aims to prevent families from spiraling into homelessness during a crisis. Their support strategies include providing government funded rental assistance and landlord mediation as well as community-based approaches.

Emergency Shelter -- While families are receiving emergency shelter and food, they receive case

management and look for housing and jobs.

Graduate Support Services --

Homelessness has many causes, and housing stability involves many solutions. To make sure that families who secure housing remain housed, Family Promise taps into the resources of its business partners and volunteers for financial literacy initiatives and mentoring, childcare and job training, food assistance, furniture and clothing donation, and health and wellness programs.



To our friends at River of Life,

Thank you for your generous gift of \$714.55 from your November Loose Coin collection. We are grateful for your continued commitment to helping provide life-changing support and opportunities for our community's homeless youth at a critical time in their lives. Youth like Carter...

Carter is one of our transitional living home residents. He called Project 16:49 after being kicked out of his family's home when he attempted to defend himself and his mother from an abusive partner. He was staying with a friend, but the family could only accommodate him for a few days. Because his family has struggled with homelessness throughout his life, Carter is very far behind in his education and had not been attending school. He didn't view graduation as 'in the cards' for his life, though it is something he very much wants.

In the few weeks Carter has been with us, his outlook has significantly improved. He immediately fit in with the other residents, and appreciates the friendship and peer support. He is excited to get back into school and earn his diploma. He picked up a temporary job right away, and is looking for something permanent. He is beginning to identify goals. More importantly, he is beginning to believe achieving those goals is possible.

Though this part of his journey is just beginning, Carter has the potential and desire to change the direction of his life. Thanks to your gift, he also now has opportunities and support to make it happen.


On behalf of all of our youth and myself, please know how much we appreciate your trust and support of the work being done at Project 16:49; and most of all, your belief and investment in our youth.
