Dear Members and Friends of The River Of Life UMC,

Yesterday I met with several of our church leaders to discuss and plan our response to the health crisis due to COVID-19. I am writing to share those plans now.

IN-PERSON SERVICES TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED:

On March 12, 2020, Governor Evers declared a public health emergency for the state of Wisconsin, encouraging leaders to cancel large gatherings. In conversation with church leaders, The River of Life UMC will cease worshipping in-person for the rest of March at both our Beloit and Clinton campuses. We will also suspend our Saturday Evening Service and Wednesday evening programming. We hope we will be able to begin gathering again on April 5, Palm Sunday.

There are many reasons for this difficult decision. It was not made in haste or without a lot of prayer, weighing options and seeking information. First, we have a social responsibility to be part of the solution to the situation. Slowing the spread of the virus is as important as stopping it. We do that by not gathering in groups through which the virus is spread. I might add, under the current guidelines during this emergency if someone in a church is diagnosed with COVID-19, it is mandatory that everyone who was in the building at that time will also be quarantined for two weeks.

CHURCH SERVICE INFORMATION:

So how will we "do" church during these weeks?

On the Sunday mornings at 9:30 am, Pastor Carlson and the Tech Team will work to livestream a shortened simplified worship service. There will be a call to worship, prayers, a message and a few recorded songs. It is our hope that you will join us online to participate by listening, praying and singing. I will also be posting a daily devotional on the website. You can find them on our website at www.rolumcwi.com. Go to the website, click on services. There you will be able to pick the service.

For anyone without internet access, a printed copy of the message will be sent via regular mail or email so that you might read it at home. But you will have to request it by calling the church office at 608-362-8866.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

We are not quarantining - only practicing social distancing to ensure everyone's health and safety. Social distancing does not mean isolation. If you know someone who does not have access to email/internet, please reach out and be church together. Pastoral care visits and home communion may be suspended until further notice. Because Hospitals and Nursing Homes are on Lock Down Pastor Carlson and others will check in via phone. In the case of extreme emergency or death, Pastor Carlson will make visits when possible.

Before you travel for any community meeting, we suggest that you contact the location. Several community support groups have suspended gathering in the coming weeks.

BUILDING CLOSED INFORMATION:

Please note that because of the corona virus, the church building will be closed to all use immediately after the worship service on Sunday March 15, 2020. On Tuesday March 17 it will be professionally cleaned and sanitized. The building will be closed with no access until further notice when we resume in person worship.

However, the church office will remain open during our normal office hours, Monday-Thursday, 10:00 - 3:00. We will be doing the recommended daily cleaning and sanitizing in the office.

Finally, though meetings and all group activities will be cancelled, our church and office will continue to operate and share ministry throughout the week. Keeping up with your financial giving makes that possible. We therefore encourage you to mail your offering to the church office. We want to make sure we can continue to support our staff, missions and building costs.

PLEASE BE ASSURED:

We are making the most careful informed decisions given the ongoing updates from public health officials and the Wisconsin Annual Conference. Please hold the community and our church in prayer as we navigate this unprecedented health crisis. 

There are other monies that come in during the year that aren't a part of the campaign year. We do meet our pledged campaign years on a positive balanced budget. UMW CHANNELS OF GIVING

Through their generosity UMW members empower And improve the lives of women, youth and children in the U.S. and around the world.

About 70% of Mission Giving funds from members go to programs and projects supporting women, children and youth. Around 20-30% stays with the local, district and conference organizations of UMW for local missions. Only 9% covers administrative costs.

The conference UMW pledges a specific amount to UMW's national office for mission with women, children and youth and retains a designated percent to be used for district and conference administration and membership development expenses.

Spontaneous gifts can be given out of gratitude for God's abundance and in celebrating the joys of life.

The World Thank Offering is an opportunity for individuals to respond to God's abundance and grace with spontaneous gifts of gratitude. The funds collected are used in the total program of mission carried out through UMW's national office in the U.S. and around the world.

3. SPECIAL MISSION RECOGNITION PINS AND CERTIFICATES

These pins offer a meaningful way to honor members who have dedicated so much time and effort to service. Gift amounts range from \$40 to \$2,000. Each year we honor a person or persons at UMW Sunday services.

4. GIFT TO MISSION

A Gift to Mission is a gift to honor someone. Cards include Thank You, for a Baby, in the Service of Christ, a Special Day, Thinking of You, Happy Birthday and assorted Christmas cards.

5. GIFT IN MEMORY

A Gift in Memory can be for a member, a friend or anyone, in any amount of \$5 or more. Gift in Memory cards are available free, and may be sent to the family of the deceased.

UMW GENERAL CONFERENCE LEGISLATION

UMW will bring four new petitions to General Conference in May this year in Minneapolis. Our hope is that they will be approved. The new petitions call on the church to prioritize women, children and youth. The four pieces of legislation to be included in the church's *Book of Resolutions*, is on observing Children's Sabbath, protecting the girl child, protecting voting rights and the status of women and realizing full human rights.

Children's Sabbath identifies the 3rd Sunday in October as the UMC U.S. observance of Children's Sabbath and adds it to the program calendar of the church. It encourage worshippers across the country to focus prayers, pro-grams, services and action on learning about problems facing children and on sacred teachings calling us to love and protect children. The petition does not seek for the observance to be one of the church's Special Sundays, so no offering collection is involved, just a call for the church to designate time to prioritize children.

The Girl Child focuses on the wellbeing of girls and the challenges preventing girls from living lives free of gender-based subjugation. This petition calls on the church to engage in advocacy to rectify conditions that limit girls from reaching their fullest potential in safe and healthy environments.

Voting Rights Protection - In 2020 the U.S. célebrates the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th amendment giving women the right to vote. As we honor the work of the women's suffrage movement we also recognize and lament that women of color in many cases did not reap benefits from passage of the 19th amendment. Despite the active work of women of color for women's suffrage, many were left without the right to vote for many more years. Voting Rights Protections in the U.S. calls attention to the disproportionate impact of voter suppression and recruits the church into ensuring all communities have access to full and equitable rights in the voting polls.

The Status of Women calls on the church to address rights of women and work toward women's equity globally in areas such as education, health, violence against women, migration, climate justice and media – work that moves us all toward Beloved Community.



EASTER RESURRECTION ROLLS

from Yummy Healthy Easy site

Prep TimeCook Time5 min.10 min.Serves 8

Total Time 15 min.

Ingredients

- 1 Tube of Pillsbury Crescent Rolls
- 1 Small Bowl of Water
- 8 large marshmallows
- 1 Small bowl of Cinnamon & Sugar mixed

Instructions:

- 1. First, gather the everyone together. Get your ingredients out and preheat the oven. Read John 19 in the New Testament while the oven is pre-heating.
- 2. Preheat over to 375°. Spray a cookie sheet with cooling spray or line with parchment paper.
- 3. Unroll the crescent rolls, separating each section. Explain that this is like the cloth they wrapped Jesus in.
- 4. Give everyone a marshmallow and explain that it represents Jesus. It's white and pure because He was without sin.
- 5. Roll the marshmallow in a small bowl of water. This symbolizes the embalming oils.
- 6. Now, roll the marshmallow in the cinnamon & sugar mixture. This is like the spices used to prepare his body for burial.
- 7. Next up, wrap the marshmallow in the crescent roll dough, making sure to pinch the dough together securely on the sides. Don't worry about what they look like because they'll taste great no matter what! This represents how they wrapped Jesus' body.
- 8. Repeat with each marshmallow and place the rolls in the oven (symbolizing the tomb) and bake for the amount of time specified on the package 8 to 10 minutes.
- 9. While the rolls are baking, read John 20:1-18.
- 10. When the cook time is up, open the tomb and remove the rolls. When they're cool enough to handle, open one and discover what happened to the marshmallow. It's disappeared! This signifies how Jesus has been resurrected.
