

From the Pastor's Desk...

Js Do you love me?
Yes, Lord!
If you love me, if you truly love me, feed my lambs.

Yes, I still have cantata on the brain!

If you received this newsletter when it was first distributed during worship, it is Easter Sunday! We sing Christ the Lord

is risen today, Alleluia! We sniff the fabulous smell of Easter Lilies. It is a glorious Sunday! But, as we said on Cantata Sunday, the story isn't over. The story continues with us.

The "Do You Love Me" song from the cantata is taken from the book of John. After the disciples had seen the resurrected Jesus, Simon Peter and several of the other disciples decided to go fishing again. They didn't catch anything. Jesus yelled to them to put the net down on the other side of the boat, and they caught more fish than would fit in the boat! STEWARDSHIP SECOND

The average tax refund last year was \$2,753. How will we spend our tax refunds this year? We know that some taxpayers do not receive a refund. But, of those who do, how do they spend it? The most popular answers are: 1) Pay off Debt; 2) Have fun - do something special or buy something special and 3) Save it. On most lists of ideas the thought of 4) Giving it Away to a favorite charity is either last on the list or never makes the list!

If we're going to "give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God," what are we called to give away? As people of faith we may wish to consider giving a tithe (10%) or some portion of our tax return to the church to say thank you to God for the jobs we have and the earnings we receive.

Consider tithing. If the average refund is \$2,753, and 20 people tithe their refund at \$275 each, the total giving to our church would increase \$5,500. That would pay much of the heating bill for the winter or help us do some kind of wonderfully creative ministry. What is God calling you to give?

April -- Caritas

April Loose Coins will go to Caritas, the community resource center founded 50 years ago by several Beloit churches, including ours. Caritas offers the largest food pantry in the area, a diaper pantry, and community garden.

Our Caritas representative, Pat Sands, reports that collections are coming in, but the needs are greater than ever. Caritas serves over 700 families per month, providing healthy food offerings, like fruits and vegetables, whole grains, and a variety of protein sources. Families can access the food pantry and the diaper pantry twice a month.

Please be generous with your Loose Coins contributions. Drop your change in the offering plate each week, and if you can, include a check or bills marked for Loose Coins.

May -- Conference Ingathering for Midwest Mission

We're giving you a heads up on the May Loose Coins so you can plan ahead!

During the month of May we will be collecting both cash (Loose Coins) and toiletries items for the Conference Ingathering, to benefit Midwest Mission.

The Ingathering is a collection sponsored by the Wisconsin Annual Conference to aid a charity selected by the Conference. They have chosen Midwest Mission again this year. Each church is asked to collect cash and in-kind donations in May and deliver them to Annual Conference in early June.

The items we will be collecting are toiletries for the Personal Dignity Kits that Midwest Mission sends out. They are listed below, and will be listed in the bulletin throughout the month of April. All items must be new, and toothbrushes and bars of soap must be individually packaged.


Personal Dignity Kit items:

- 1 Hand Towel No kitchen towels
- 1 Washcloth No dishcloths
- 1 Adult Toothbrush No multi-packs
- 1 Bar Soap 3-4 oz.
- 1 Shampoo 12-19 oz.
- 1 Deodorant 2-3 oz. stick, roll-on, or pump
- 1 Lotion 8-10 oz.
- 11-gal. Resealable Plastic Bag



Note: You do **not** need to bring a complete Personal Dignity Kit (although some people enjoy doing that). You might bring just a few items, or multiples of one or more items. For example, you might want to give 12 bars of soap, or 5 adult toothbrushes.

We'll remind you throughout April so you can start shopping, and the collection will begin in May. Thank you!
