

### From the Pastor's Desk



I don't really like to garden, so I don't have a vegetable garden. I like perennial flowers because I don't have a lot of time to take care of flowers. Actually, I like planting things. I just very much do not like weeding!

And yet, there I was, trying to clear the weeds out before they completely take over the daffodils and daylilies. I barely made a dent. The weeds came up fierce this year. I primarily have grass with extremely

long, well connected roots that travel only a couple of inches below the surface. I pull on a tuft of grass and 6-10 inches of root follow along before the root breaks. Sometimes they are well over a foot long. Occasionally, one tuft of grass connects to another tuft of grass through that root.

It got me thinking: how are your roots? How strong are you below the surface? How connected are you?

Every metaphor breaks down: you are not a weed. But you are meant to have strong roots of faith. How is life pulling at you? In what ways do you feel connected to God? How are you tending to your spiritual life? Are you praying? Are you reading your Bible regularly? Are you watching for Confluence Moments?

I have been trying to rid this particular flower bed of this grass for five years. I don't think I will ever succeed. I pray that your roots are so strong, that no matter what happens in your life, you will continue to always grow strong!
