

From the Pastor's Desk

I'm looking out my window at my lilac bushes. They still have nice flowers on them, but they were not what I was expecting.

We went to a nursery last spring to order several lilac bushes. I specifically said that I wanted purple lilacs. Since we ordered two trees and the lilacs, we paid for the nursery to come and plant them. After they left, I noticed that the tag had a picture of a pink flower on it. I looked closer. We had gotten four Miss Canada lilac bushes. Miss Canada lilacs are pink. My lilacs are pink, not purple!

Now, I like pink as much as any girly-girl. But I often like purple better, and I wanted purple lilacs. These lilac bushes were supposed to outlive my time in this house. They were supposed to grow big and beautiful. And they were supposed to be purple. Instead, when it finally comes time for me to move out of this house, I will have beautiful, large, pink lilac bushes.

It may seem silly for me to spend so much time on my disappointment in the color of my lilac bushes, but aren't we like that? Don't we spend way too much time disappointed in the little, inconsequential things? And disappointment, even in inconsequential things, leads to complaining, like I seem to have done here.

The Old Testament is full of the Israelites' complaining. In the New Testament, Paul wrote a lot about how we should not complain. Jesus said you are the salt of the earth. Jesus said you are the light to the world. Jesus didn't say as long as we don't complain we are salt and light. He said that we are. That means Jesus expects us to spend our time loving God and loving people. Jesus expects that we will not waste our time complaining about inconsequential things. Being salt and light are too important for us to do anything else.

On Pentecost Sunday we talked about asking God to set us on fire with the Holy Spirit. We talked about some ways our congregation is already set to really BE the church and make a tremendous difference in the lives of others. We talked about some ways the congregation is already set to be such a strong force that people can't help but be drawn to Jesus through it. We talked about how we could up our game in loving people into taking their next step with Jesus.

My pink lilacs are actually very pretty. There are probably bright sides to the little inconsequential things you complain about too. May we see the beauty in all things, and then move forward in being all that God has intended us to be.





Juneteenth Day, June 19, is now a Federal Holiday.

There will be no mail delivery June 20 (sign on post office door)

Juneteenth Day celebrates the day in which slaves in Texas were actually freed. Lincoln had issued the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, but many in Texas were held in slavery for over two more years. On June 19, 1865, Major General Gordon Granger announced in Galveston, TX that both the Civil War and slavery were ended. LOOSE COINS

FOR THE REST OF JUNE.... Loose Coins will go to **Rock Valley Community Programs** (RVCP). RVCP is a 115-bed residential facility that focuses on two at-risk populations in the Rock County area: homeless military veterans and offenders transitioning from the correctional system. Located at the former Caravilla site between Beloit and Janesville, RVCP offers housing, addiction and mental health treatment, and a range of supportive counseling to help clients successfully transition to independent living. RVCP also offers outpatient care to anyone needing assistance with addiction and/or mental health treatment. In cooperation with many other local agencies, RVCP works to restore people to full and independent lives.

FOR JULY

JULY Loose Coin offerings will be divided between the two food pantries, **Caritas** and the **Clinton Food Pantry**. Our Beloit-area United Methodist churches have a strong history of supporting local food pantries.

Caritas (serving the greater Beloit area) was started nearly 50 years ago by five local congregations, including the former First UMC downtown. Today, Caritas is a community-supported nonprofit serving 700-800 families per month with a food pantry and diaper bank -- and our church has faithfully supported it through volunteerism and donations.

In Clinton, where the Food Pantry is located next door to our Clinton campus, the Clinton church offers a free pancake breakfast coinciding with the food pantry pickup day every month. Why free? Tom Alverson says, "When someone walks in, I don't know their situation. I don't know when they had their last meal."

With food and housing costs higher than ever right now, food insecurity is also on the rise. Caritas reports that they are serving 75 more families per month than last year, and yet food donations are down by 40,000 pounds this year compared to last. Director Max Dodson says the best way to help is to donate money. Food pantries can buy three to five times more food than you could buy in a grocery store with the same money. Please be generous with your Loose Coins!

Sunshine, beaches, lakes, family, road trips, sports, no school, and no church? Summer is a great time to be with family. But, did you know summer months is also a very challenging time for many church members and the church itself?

#1 – Take a vacation from church!

Every summer people get out of the habit of attending church. It usually starts with "legitimate reasons" around family, work, or play. But, after awhile a thought enters the mind, "I don't need church to have a relationship with God." Obviously, we can walk with God outside of church, but we're stretching this idea to benefit our self-centered interest as well. I've never seen a spiritually mature Christian who is not committed to their local church. During the summer months, when you are in town, attend your local church! When you're out of town, watch their videos, church emails, etc. You will enjoy life more when you stay connected to the biblical community God has put in your life. There is no substitute for corporate worship, serving others on weekends, and encouraging others in person, who are walking by faith. Your presence at church encourages others! Incidentally, when you are out of town, go to church! It's great opportunity to see God move in other churches! Maybe God has a word for you!

#2 – Take a vacation from giving!

Every summer there are people that stop honoring God with their finances. Usually the logic is, "I'll pick it up again after summer ends." So, they use their tithe or offering, that typically goes to God, and give it to beaches, road trips, lakes, or summer toys in their life. Sometimes there is a thought that, "I'll catch up later." Both thoughts are not realistic. Rarely, does someone come to church in September with a check for missed tithes in June, July, and August. It just doesn't happen. Something practical you can do is set up automatic giving through your church E-giving program. This will ensure your giving stays strong during the summer, and you don't take a break from honoring God with your finances. After all, who do you think has blessed you to the point that you can enjoy the good things of life? By the way, expenses do not change in the summer months in most churches! Enjoy your vacation. Honor your God.

#3 – Take a vacation from reading your bible!

Every summer trip involves a new routine. We are routine oriented people. When we're out of our routine, it's very easy to get out of good habits, like reading your bible and doing your daily devotions. Be intentional about spending time with God, even on your vacation! You will discover you will actually be more enjoyable to others, and you will have much more patience for others too! Most of all, maybe God has a word to share with you during that summer break! Some of my greatest moments with God happened while I was reading my bible on my vacation. When you open your bible, spend time with Jesus Christ. Don't rush through scripture or prayer. Learn to talk to have conversation with the one who loves you.

Take time to reflect on your church's vision statement; Loving people into taking their next step with Jesus.
