



Following is our third book in review. There are five books in all. This review falls in the category of Spiritual Growth and is titled "What's Your Story – Seeing Your Life Through God's Eyes". This book was written by Sarah Heath and she tells us how Joseph's story can help us tell our story.

Sarah is the pastor of First United Methodist Church in Costa Mesa, California. With roots in Canada and Mississippi, she is a graduate of Duke Divinity School and an ordained elder in the California-Pacific Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. She is an actor, artist author and speaker. Sarah uses her many gifts to share God's love with others. She writes about finding our identity in Christ and using our unique gifts to serve God and others.


Just before I started reading "What's Your Story" I read Genesis 37 – 50 about Joseph's life and learned of the many twists in his life. The author makes a correlation between his life story and our life story. Sarah encourages us to see our life story as a part of God's story as Joseph's was. One thing the author points out is God never directly talks to Joseph, however he did co-write his story with God by pursuing good desires, living into the roles he had been given, growing through conflict, living faithfully in whatever circumstances he found himself, and finding redemption in the many plot twists of his life.

The author tells us to look for a theme in our life. We need to reflect on our life

and see the connecting threads that leads us to where we are today. I was able to see my life theme as a result of reading this book. I have been doing a lot of reflecting in the last two months on God's purpose for me and what my next chapter in life is to be. I think I have finally figured that out thanks to prayers, contemplation and reading this book.

UMW: WOMEN IN MISSION

Ann Hegge has done so much for UMW most of which took place at Orfordville UMW. Her involvement goes back to the 1970's when she got acquainted with a wonderful group of women who were of like minds, interested in their journey in faith, mission work and helping each other. Their fundraisers for missions included funeral lunches, bake sales among other projects.

Ann became President of Orfordville UMW in the 1980's and 1990's and was in that role for 8-10 years. During her time in office Ann organized a Spiritual Growth retreat on a Friday evening and all day on Saturday. Reverend Sue D'Alessio was the speaker and facilitator. Ann became a certified Lay Speaker in approximately 1986. As a Lay Speaker she preached at a number of churches on UMW Sunday, which included New Horizon in Footville and Orfordville, Mt. Zion in Janesville, Cambridge, Beloit First, Beloit New Hope, Milton United Methodist Church, Edgerton and Fort Atkinson. She also gave sermons a few times at Cedar Crest Nursing Home in Janesville. Ann said, "Giving sermons was not an easy thing for me to do. I struggled with it but I always felt I got a lot out of it. I enjoyed the research and the reading and trying to take a Bible verse and bring some meaning to it, analyze it and make it relevant to us in today's world." She moved up in the Wisconsin Conference of UMW hierarchy by becoming the Spiritual Growth Officer in what was then called the Capitol District from 1992 to 1998. She did a workshop on "Our Faith Journey" for a District Meeting.

Ann shared the many opportunities she had through UMW. She took a 3 day mission trip and helped in day care at Northcott Neighborhood House in Milwaukee and painted a stairway in a woman's home.

On another mission trip she went to the Red Bird Mission in Kentucky. She sorted Campbell Soup labels which enabled them to work toward getting a van. Then they went onto Savannah, Georgia and visited a downtown Methodist church, which was very old and their pastor told them a lot about the history of Savannah and John Wesley's visit there. They visited Simon Island where John Wesley stayed and visited the museum. Her last stop was in Charleston, South Carolina and a step-on guide gave them the history of the city and its part in the Civil War.

Ann said, "Being involved in UMW at both the local and District level has been a wonderful experience." She met many women from different backgrounds, became friends with some wonderful ladies and has grown as a Christian and as a member of the Methodist Church.

What an accomplished woman. I think she has paid her dues to UMW, big time.


We're Going Back To School





Thank you to all for the wonderful get well cards, calls and visits I received since having my recent hip surgery! I know the encouragement has helped and I am doing quite well post-operatively!




