

Last weekend Dan and I traveled the 6-hour round trip to see our grandchildren. The town festival was going on, and we were planning on going to the parade together. Our granddaughter was very disappointed when it was raining and wouldn't stop, because she assumed we wouldn't go. But since they didn't cancel the parade, we decided to go in the rain!

Only about a third of the parade entries came. Dan and I, our grandkids, our son and daughter-in-law, and some of her extended family were the

only people watching the parade on the whole block where we were standing. But we each had an umbrella and we stayed fairly dry. As each parade entry went by, they threw an exorbitant amount of candy and everyone waved to the children. When the high school band marched by, they stopped directly in front of us and played us a song while standing in the rain. And then when the drumline from a nearby town walked by, they also gave a little show – just for us. You would never have thought they were performing in the rain by their enthusiasm. We clapped and cheered! I was expecting to be miserable, and it was a delightful time! The kids said they wanted it to rain again next year, so we could have the parade all to ourselves again!

Sometimes, when we think something is going to turn out miserable, we are surprised and what we thought was going to be negative, turns out to be what makes it special.

Our relationship with God is like that. Sometimes God asks us to do something we don't want to do, or a situation arises that would be good for our spiritual growth, and we avoid it. But it is often those times that God surprises us with something unexpected and it is a surprising blessing.

Knit & Crochet With A Mission Group



UMW Lesson for August The Title

Generous Hearts and Strong Threads

This lesson concludes the 2020-2021 theme of Knitted Together for God's Good Work Although circles do not meet in August, the material in this lesson is very interesting and worth exploring by yourself.

The Objective:

To understand the role of women behind the scenes in building the tabernacle, and to commit ourselves to valuing the work of all women through advocacy for fair-wage practices.

The Scripture:

Exodus 35:4-29 and Acts 9:36-42

The Lesson

God gave Moses specific directions for building the tabernacle, the furnishings, the sacred objects and the vestments worn by the priests. These things were made of the finest materials by the finest of craftspeople. Women have always been involved with the production of fabrics from the spinning of the thread to the weaving of the finished articles.

The building of the tabernacle was a community affair, each producer of the materials and each producer of the finished articles was important. They all worked together to the glory of God. In Acts we read the story of Tabitha who made garments for the needy. Later we see the needlework of women in producing fabrics for the Winchester Cathedral in England.

This has not changed today. UMW supports woman's initiatives in many countries, teaching them to become self- sufficient with the works of their hands. UMW women complete blankets, scarves, hats, mittens, sweaters and other garments for use in our local community. You can support efforts to



improve the lives of women afar with your gifts of money and improve lives of women here with the work of your hands.

Closing Litany (abbreviated)

One voice: O God of the mountains, concealed in mystery and majesty, hear us now. Many voices: We have seen your glory and grace revealed in the lives of women, children and youth; we have seen your manifold gifts in their skills and labor.

Hello from the Trustees!

The job of the Trustees Committee is to "oversee, maintain, and supervise all local church property." This includes the exterior and the interior of the church. We keep very busy doing what is needed to maintain our church property.

Much of what we do is volunteer work done by members who work behind the scenes to minimize costs.

We have also had to make some very important decisions that required careful planning on how to spend designated monies. We are happy to report to the congregation on two of the more major improvements:

- 1. All church buildings (Clinton Campus, Beloit Campus, and the Office) now have new and updated furnaces, air conditioning, and air purifiers. All the units in each building were starting to show their ages, and parts would soon be unavailable. We feel very fortunate that we could make sure that they were replaced before an emergency happened to force a quick and more costly replacement.
- 2. The garage roof in Clinton was replaced.

We are thankful that both projects could be accomplished before winter set in and before materials became even more costly and became even harder to get. We thank the congregation for trusting in our judgements. We thank the office for their support. Every month we begin and end our meetings with a prayer asking for guidance to make good decisions on behalf of the entire congregation. We thank God for His guidance.
