From the Pastor's Desk



I haven't had children school for quite a while now, so when I think about school, I think about fall programming at church!

This year, as most years at River of Life UMC, we have two fall kickoffs. The first is our Sunday School kick-off. This year we have a two day kick off, including a movie night and fun after-worship rally day activities. These are for all ages, so I hope you will attend.

Then in October, we will kick off our Tutoring and Wednesday night activities. I hope you will attend dinner and Bible Study.

Since we have returned to the building after the Pandemic, we have two issues in children and youth programming. First, we have lost many of our remaining teens, children and families. They have moved on. Please pray for our youth and families to see their need for God. Pray for us to reach out to children and youth that we have connected to in other ways, and help us reach them for Jesus.

An even larger issue is that we have lost leadership. We are limited in the number of children we can take for tutoring by the number of tutors that we have. Please pray for people to feel called to be leaders.

Action is important too. Might God be calling you to lead or help in some way? Do you know someone you could talk to, to see if they might be blessed by leading in some way?

There are so many children, youth and families that are in need of Jesus. They probably don't know it. A church family would bless them. Growing in faith would bless them. Would you pray for them? Would you pray for leaders? Would you pray that we can break through into loving new people into taking their next or first step with Jesus?

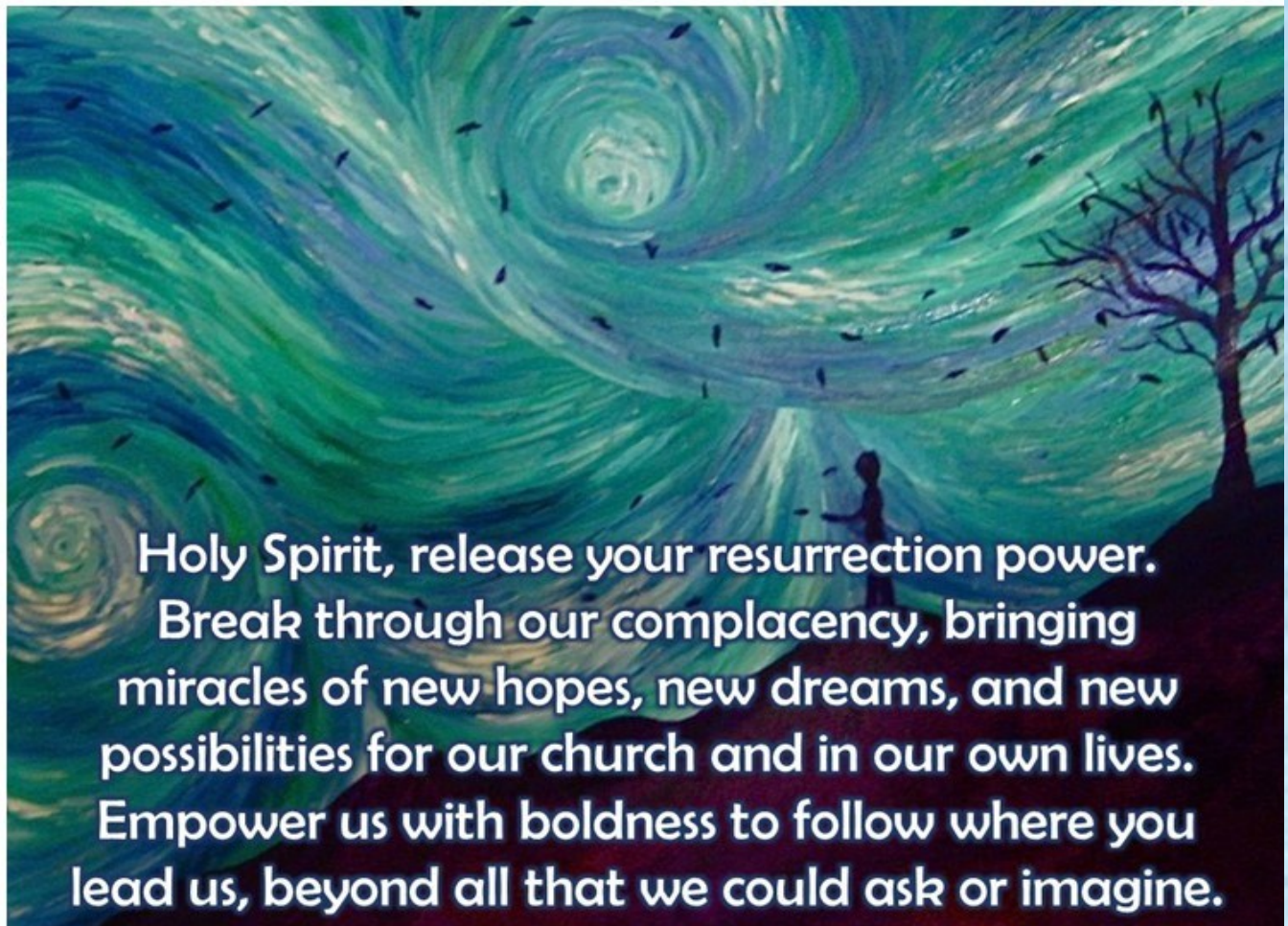

LOOSE COINS

Our Loose Coin offerings for September will be going to **Midwest Mission Distribution Center**, the emergency supply depot where our adult mission trips go.

Midwest Mission is a cooperating depot with UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief), but they also work with a number of other relief agencies, both to receive requests for emergency aid and to handle the shipping of supplies to the areas of need.

Some of the emergency kits that Midwest Mission packs on a regular basis include Personal Dignity Kits (toiletries), Home Care Kits (flood buckets), Layette Kits, and Student Kits (school supplies). In addition they do Rice Meal Packs (usually off-site), build Student Desks (which are shipped as ready-to-assemble kits), and refurbish bicycles and sewing machines that can provide a living for people in Latin America or Africa.

We learned in recent newsletters that Personal Dignity Kits assembled by our mission team (and others) in May were sent in early July to Honduras through a Food for the Poor program that serves children in group and foster homes. Another shipment that included “our” Personal Dignity Kits, along with Student Kits, went to Northcott Children’s Home in Milwaukee, UM Children’s Services in Milwaukee, and Harbor House in Superior, Wis. Midwest Mission ships around the world (including to Ukraine) and around the U.S. in response to disasters or to ongoing poverty.

For those who are interested in helping Maui..... Both Midwest Mission and UMCOR are responding to the disaster. If you wish, you may write your check (or donate through the church website) to either organization and mark it for Maui. Or, you may give in the traditional way to Loose Coins and it will go to Midwest Mission to be used as needed. Thank you for your support of these vital (United Methodist) humanitarian agencies!

**Adult Mission Trip to
Midwest Mission Distribution Center
Chatham, Illinois
April 3 - 5, 2024**

Join our team volunteering at the Midwest Mission Distribution Center! You can choose to stay on-site at the dormitory or stay 7 miles away at the Comfort Inn and Suites in Springfield, IL. We leave Beloit the morning of Wednesday, April 3, and carpool to Springfield, IL. We will work on Thursday and Friday, and return to Beloit on Friday evening, Apr. 5.

If you stay in the dormitory, the cost of the trip is \$160 plus the cost of one lunch and three dinners at area restaurants. If you choose to stay at the motel, the cost of the trip is \$75 plus the cost your room at the Comfort Inn and the cost of the previous meals. The Comfort Inn room will be approximately \$115 per room per night. You are welcome to arrange to share a room with another person on the trip.

Please do NOT let the cost of the trip keep you from signing up! There is money available in a fund specifically to help people with the cost of participating in the adult mission trip.

Please let Diane Gemignani know if you are interested in the assistance.

Payment Schedule is:

\$50 deposit due by February 1, 2024*

Balance due by March 31, 2004*

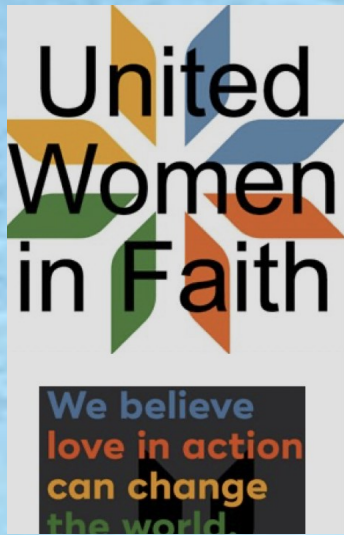

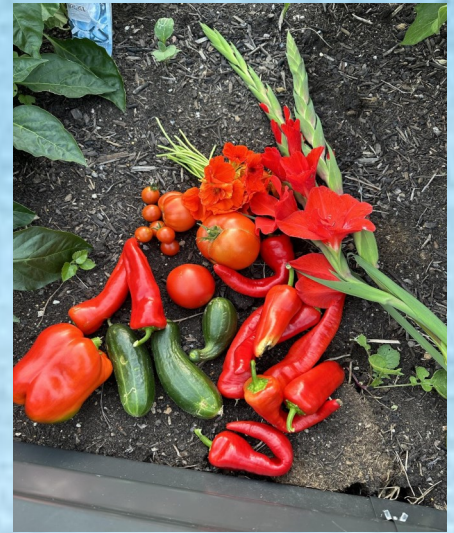

“Your bees are swarming!” My wife stuck her head inside the door and gave me news no beekeeper wants to hear. I ran outside to see thousands of bees flying up from the hive to the top of a tall pine, never to return.

I was a little behind reading the clues that the hive was about to swarm; more than a week of storms had hampered my inspections. The morning the storms ended, the bees left. The colony was new and healthy, and the bees were actually dividing the colony to start a new one. “Don’t be hard on yourself,” an experienced beekeeper told me cheerfully after seeing my disappointment. “This can happen to anyone!”

Encouragement is a winsome gift. When David was disheartened because Saul was pursuing him to take his life, Saul’s son Jonathan encouraged David. “Don’t be afraid” Jonathan said. “My father Saul will not lay a hand on you. You will be king over Israel, and I will be second to you. Even my father Saul knows this” (1 Samuel 23:17).

Those are surprisingly selfless words from someone next in line to the throne. It’s likely Jonathan recognized that God was with David, so he spoke out of a humble heart of faith.

Dear Members and Friends of The River of Life UMC,

The Finance Committee would like to provide you with information about our apportionment obligation as the result of questions and comments received. The calculation is a combination of our membership and local expenses and their relationship to these items for the Wisconsin Conference. The apportionment amount for The River of Life UMC is \$53,071 for 2023. This amounts to approximately \$233 for each of the 228 members used in the calculation.

The apportionments received by the Wisconsin Conference is allocated to 5 different areas, Conference Support Ministries, Local Congregational Development, Clergy and Lay Leadership, Connectional Ministries, and Global Connectional Ministries. A short summary of what each area covers follows:

Conference Support Ministries: Operation and maintenance of the Conference Center in Sun Prairie, Accounting, legal and other support administration.

Local Congregational Development: Salaries and expenses for 5 district superintendents, the assistant to the Bishop and two District Administrators, Assistance to clergy and churches with emergency financial needs.

Clergy and Lay Leadership: Leadership to conference committees and training, Training for church renewal through Missional Church Consultation Initiative (MCCI), Recruitment and nurturing of future and current ordained ministry, Assistance to churches to pay minimum compensation for full time clergy, Health insurance for active, retired and disabled clergy, Coordination of pension benefits for active, retired and disabled clergy.

Connectional Ministries: Operations of Pine Lake and Lake Lucerne camps and retreat centers, Support for health and welfare agencies like Northcott Neighborhood House, UM Children's Services and Harbor House, Communications and technology to connect with churches, Membership and support of the Wisconsin Council of Churches, and Salaries and benefits for Conference staff.

Global Connectional Ministries: Africa University, Black College Fund, World Service Fund, Interdenominational Fund, North Central Jurisdictional Conference Fund and Episcopal Fund to support Bishops.
