I am so very grateful that we live in a part of the world that has seasons. I get as excited as the children for the first snowfall! I love how the flowers begin to poke up in the early spring! I love how energizing the sun is in the summer! And I love the way the leaves know to turn colors in the fall!

I am a huge lover of science. I love that faith tells us why (God created us to love us and for us to love each other),

but science tells us how. When the temperatures become cooler and the days become shorter, the chlorophyl in the leaves stop making food for the leaves. Chlorophyl is green: less chlorophyl, less green. When there is less green, the other colors, that were already in the leaves, begin to be seen.

Isn't that incredible! The color was already there! We just couldn't see it!

So often in our lives we get discouraged because we can't see what we want to see. What we even, perhaps, need to see, is hidden. How long is this going to last: whatever this is? Whatever you are going through right now, reach out to others. Most people are going through something, and helping lift others up helps lift us up too. Offer one another hope. Everything will be okay. Hang on to hope.
