From the Pastor's Desk

I recently went on a fabulous retreat at Pine Lake Camp. I went for some soul work, to get my spirit renewed by the God who is so very present at camp. It was everything I needed. I am trying to decide if I will invite some of you to come with me the next time it is offered, or if I will create our own retreat so more of us can go.

There were many wonderful experiences, but the one that is strong on my heart today is not one I expected would have such an impact on me: the night hike.

One would expect a night hike to be a hike with flashlights. It wasn't. It was a walk through the woods, in the dark! In silence! The stars were just beginning to come out as we adjusted our eyes. Nick, the Site Director, encouraged us to hold hands with a partner for stability. As we walked into the woods on an access road, I could barely see the people in front of me. When it was time to turn down a trail (wide enough for two people side-by-side), the couple in front of us waited to show us the turn in, so we waited for the next couple to show them the turn in. When we began walking again, we couldn't see anybody in front of us anymore! So we just started walking!

Slowly, one step at a time, we made our way forward. We couldn't see it, but it just felt like we were on the path. We could kind-of see trees and bushes to our sides. After what seemed like a very long time, all of the sudden we could very vaguely see Nick and he let us know we had made it to the worship site.

In the dark, Nick talked about the cones and rods in our eyes and how they work in night vision. He told us that our bodies have muscle memory, and since we had already been to that worship site twice, our bodies kind-of knew how to get there. Nick told us to use flashlights on our way back, and we were amazed to realize that the path curved! We had followed a curvy path in the dark!

This experience left me in awe: in awe of the God who created our amazing bodies that can kind-of see in the dark and can sense where we are; in awe of the God who created creatures that make wonderful night sounds; in awe of the God who created the planets and stars and galaxies that are very bright when it is very dark. In awe that this immense God that is beyond description loves me and loves you.

I hope you regularly take time away so that you can let God renew and restore your soul. I hope you can regularly take time to experience the wonders of our God. Maybe you will come with me on retreat next time, so that we can experience our remarkable God together.



Family Promise of Greater Beloit

Loose coins for October go to **Family Promise of Greater Beloit**. Family Promise is an emergency shelter program for homeless families. ---Partnering with church congregations makes it possible for them to host 3-4 families at a time, 365 days a year. Congregations provide space in their buildings for one week at a time, offering food, hospitality, and a temporary home for families going through a difficult time.

Family Promise has a day center at 655 Bluff St., where families go during the day to shower, receive case management, and look for housing and jobs. It is affiliated with a national network of 200+ Family Promise agencies, based on a model of providing extensive support services while existing congregational resources provide nightly housing and food at a fraction of the cost of permanent shelters.

The mission is to go beyond shelter to provide a better future for families in crisis. Congregational support is essential to fulfill the mission of Family Promise. Some churches provide the physical space to shelter families, some congregations provide additional food and volunteers, and some provide financial support to sustain the day center and its staff and programming. The need is great. Please give generously.

-- Others did wood-working, sorting items for kits, and tracing sewing patterns.





















PAPER STRIP PUMPKIN CRAFT

Turn construction paper and a toilet paper roll into a fantastic homemade decoration for fall.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Orange & Green construction paper
- Scissors

• Toilet paper roll

• Scotch tape

HOW TO MAKE YOUR PAPER STRIP PUMPKIN CRAFT:

- 1. Cut the toilet paper roll in half. Cut a strip of orange construction paper that will wrap around the toilet paper roll completely and tape the paper into place.
- 2. Cut the orange construction paper vertically into 1 in. strips You will need 8 to 10 strips.
- 3. Work with one end of the toilet paper roll at a time. Tape one end of the orange construction paper to the inside of one end of the tp roll. Repeat with the remaining strips of paper until you have the makings of a flower look.
- 4. Now you need to tape the other end of each strip into the other end of the tp roll. Do this just as you did before.
- 5. Once you have all of the orange strips of paper taped into place, cut a leaf out of green paper and tape it into the hole to complete your pumpkin.
