From the Pastor's Desk



Loss is always hard. Throughout our lives we experience a lot of loss. But one thing we don't expect to lose is our church building.

I remember when I was serving my first church. Somebody came in after not being there for nearly two decades and said, "Everything is exactly the same! Nothing has changed!" Although this isn't a good thing, it is comforting to always have a church building with the same carpet and the same decorations to go back to. This may not help to make new disciples of Jesus Christ, but it is comforting.

This past week we sold our Clinton Campus Building. It was formerly Faith Community United Methodist Church, before that the Clinton United Methodist Church, before that the Clinton Methodist Church, and before that the Clinton Methodist Episcopal Church. There were 179 years of Methodism in Clinton, and over 160 of those years were in the same building. And now that building is sold, and it is discomforting.

The River of Life Church has a lot of history with selling churches. Many if not most of our River of Life members have lost at least one church building, if not multiple buildings. Those of you who are here have adjusted well. I wonder how many people we lost because closing a church building is really hard. I hope that no Clinton folks will be lost because of their building closing.

With that in mind, I would ask you to be praying over those folks. If you are a Clinton member, be sure to reach out to each other. If you are a Beloit member with connection to Clinton folks, please reach out. I would love for everyone to come to the Beloit Campus, but there will be some that won't. Wherever people decide to worship God and serve, everyone needs to be loved into taking their next step with Jesus.







Adult Mission Trip to Midwest Mission Distribution Center Chatham, Illinois April 3 - 5, 2024

Join our team volunteering at the Midwest Mission Distribution Center! You can choose to stay on-site at the dormitory or stay 7 miles away at the Comfort Inn and Suites in Springfield, IL. We leave Beloit the morning of Wednesday, April 3, and carpool to Springfield, IL. We will work on Thursday and Friday, and return to Beloit on Friday evening, Apr. 5.

If you stay in the dormitory, the cost of the trip is \$160 plus the cost of one lunch and three dinners at area restaurants. If you choose to stay at the motel, the cost of the trip is \$75 plus the cost your room at the Comfort Inn and the cost of the previous meals. The Comfort Inn room will be approximately \$115 per room per night. You are welcome to arrange to share a room with another person on the trip.

Please do NOT let the cost of the trip keep you from signing up! There is money available in a fund specifically to help people with the cost of participating in the adult mission trip. Please let Diane Gemignani know if you are interested in the assistance.




United Women in Faith General News



LOOSE COINS Family Promise of Greater Beloit

Loose coins for October go to Family Promise of Greater Beloit. Family Promise is an emergency shelter program for homeless families, providing temporary shelter and extensive support services to help families in crisis secure housing and stable employment.

This is the organization that was formerly called Hands of Faith. In 2017 they had a "small renaissance" to re-energize the organization and re-brand it to align with the name change of their national parent organization. "Family Promise" reflects the broad range of programs and the vision of ending family homelessness. The name refers to the promise, in the sense of commitment, which communities make to families in need. And it also refers to the promise, the potential, inherent in every family.

In their new, larger facility at 1006 Bluff St., their mission is to provide shelter, food, clothing and life skills to families facing homelessness. This includes preventive programs, to keep families from becoming homeless in the first place, and also follow-up support for families who transition into

their own homes and new jobs.

Family Promise of Greater Beloit is itself in transition, as they are currently conducting a search for a new executive director. The interim director is Amanda OKane, who spoke in our church last fall along with former director Tammy King. Together with their corporate volunteers and United Way support, Family Promise counts on Beloit area churches to help sustain their programming. I'm sure they could use our prayers as well, as they search for the ideal candidate to lead them forward.
